Isaiah came to us with a lot of enthusiasm and we hoped that our program would be an opportunity for him to learn about mechanics, learn responsibility and we would get a chance to build into him and speak into his life. It was a rough start with limited engagement and then a lot of no shows. After some communication between him and his social worker, he came in and we had a great conversation about his commitment to the program.

That same day, Isaiah surprisingly opened up a lot about his life to us and to our two boys, currently apprenticing as mechanics. They were able to share about their own brothers who had gotten involved in gangs as well and how being plugged into church community and a relationship with God had really helped them get free of that lifestyle. Watching our two young guys show leadership like that, was awesome. I felt so encouraged by how the day went and to see this young man open up to all of us and let us in a little bit. It was surprising the next day then, when Isaiah didn't show up again and then a few days later texted me that he wasn't going to stay involved in our program. mainly it seemed for selfish reasons and poor follow through.

One of the toughest things about youth work is to see kids struggle and be unable to do anything for them. They often make poor choices and you have to trust that God will do the work in their hearts and in their lives just as He does with each of us in the right time. Because of this, we count it a privilege to get an opportunity to walk alongside the lives of each of the youth God places in our path. As for Isaiah, we trust that the sense of community, love and acceptance we offered him during that short time will have lasting impact and possibly bring him back in the future.
