

# YOUTH GUIDANCE JENN LABIUK

When I was 2, my family moved from Victoria. to Calgary and started attending Altadore Baptist Church. This is where I was raised in my faith. I was young but there was one person that the Lord was highlighting to me and whom I would watch, observe and pay explicit attention to his interactions with others and this person was Bernie Adam (from Youth Unlimited). From my perspective, back then, I was curious and in awe of him; he was a cool dude and stood out from others with his long hair and awesome style but it was more than that that set him apart. The relationships he cultivated with those around him in our church family and with the youth/teens was something I had never really seen before. He was warm, genuine and had a heart for others that was easy to witness. What stuck out most to me was the relationship he had with a youth that was definitely a youth at risk (although I was not familiar with that term back then) and Bernie loved him well and poured into his life week after week. It was beautiful to witness as he seemed different around Bernie than anyone else.

When I was 9 or 10, Bernie was brought up to the front of the church on a Sunday morning to get commissioned for a new job/ministry that he was called to and that would be where he still is today with Youth Unlimited/Youth For Christ. I had no idea what that meant or even what that was but for some reason the Lord had set that moment firm in my memories. I became a youth at risk myself due to a series of circumstances. We left Altadore when I was 15 years old as my parents followed my brother and I to a community church that we wanted to attend. I gave my life to Jesus at 16 and was baptized a few months later. I ended up moving to Victoria, BC with my mom when my parents divorced when I was 17 and pregnant with my first child. I heard the call to work with youth when my teen years got messy at 13 but I didn't know how or what it would look like.

In Victoria, I became like the prodigal son but Jesus beckoned me back to Himself. Now, all these years later starting out in ministry for YFC Victoria, giving to youth what I myself have received and what I observed all those years ago with Bernie is how I model the ministry the Lord has called me to.
